Deputy Reeve Sarapuk called the public hearing for Bylaw 1302-23 to order at 1:06 p.m.

Deputy Reeve Sarapuk asked if the public hearing for proposed Bylaw 1302-23 was properly advertised. Caitlin Smith, Director of Planning & Agriculture answered that the Bylaw was advertised in accordance with the Municipal Government Act.

Deputy Reeve Sarapuk asked the Development Authority to outline the proposed Bylaw 1302-23 Land Use Bylaw Amendment to Rezone Part of SW-2-106-15-W5 from Agricultural "A" to Institutional "I".

Caitlin Smith, Director of Planning & Agriculture presented the following:

Administration has received a request to rezone Part of SW-2-106-15-W5M from Agricultural "A" to Institutional "I" to accommodate the construction of a church and school.

The purpose of the Institutional district is to allow for a variety of public and private uses that provide medical, public safety, religious and cultural services/amenities to the community. The proposed rezoning area is 13 acres.

Currently there is one (1) residential yard site on this part of the quarter section. There are three (3) separate titles on the remainder of the quarter section, two (2) residential yard sites and one (1) commercial yard site.

According to the Hamlet of La Crete Area Structure Plan, Section 3.6 Institutional and Community Services Policies states:

Facilities A.

• The County should encourage the development of institutional land uses that provide cultural, social or health services to residents. This includes a library and associated open space in the Town Centre Area and a new recreational center (as demand requires) located in a General Commercial Area.

The utilities department does not have any servicing concerns.

Proposed Bylaw 1302-23 was presented to the Municipal Planning Commission on July 13, 2023 where the following motion was made:

Councillor Braun – At 1st reading was access and dust control discussed?

Administration – Yes.

Councillor Wardley – So as far as road upgrades or dust control, why does it have to wait until the development permit stage? Administration – This item is brought to the Council only for land use rezoning, development specifications come at time of subdivision and development permit as conditions of approval.

Deputy Reeve Sarapuk asked if any submissions were received in regards to proposed Bylaw 1302-23. There were 4 submissions received which were included in the agenda package and were read by Caitlin Smith, Director of Planning & Agriculture.

Deputy Reeve Sarapuk asked if there was anyone present who would like to speak in regards to the proposed Bylaw 1302-23. There were members of the public present to speak to the proposed bylaw.

Jonathan Goertzen – Asked if Council had any questions, concerns are clearly written in his submission. If the property is developed, will there be restrictions applied and will the road be upgraded at the cost of the County or developer and are not to have negative affects to surrounding people?

Council – yes, restrictions will need to be applied. This is at the discretion of the development authority.

Council - Did you just buy an acre or so and add it to your property?

Jonathan Goertzen – Yes, just for a buffer zone, again I'm not against the rezoning. I just want to ensure that there are written conditions in the development stages, to ensure privacy, road upgrades, the intersection of TWP 1060 and RR152 needs to be upgraded.

Council – This is a large cost to the developer.

Jonathan Goertzen – Then there should be fair for the county to add to budget to upgrade the corner to minimum standards due to the amount of traffic. The Church is open for 5 days a week and the school as well. I'm not opposed to the rezoning restrictions need to be put in place, my neighbours are a closer distance from the road and already experience lots of dust. I do what I can for dust control at my place but with the amount of traffic =, the dust control doesn't do much. There is a steady hazard of dust, so something needs to be done and it's a huge expense.

Council – If we work with developer and County would the adjacent landowners be willing to pay a levy for paving?

Ryan Wolfe – My tax bill is a whole lot already, its not a fair expense for 6 landowners and a whole lot more users.

Council – I don't believe it is fair to put the whole expense on the few landowners on the road.

Ryan Wolfe – I stated my concerns in my letter as well, there's already dust coating my yard when there is an east wind. There's heavy traffic and no dust control and it will be a constant dust when you add a church and school. Even if its oiled up and down the road it will not last, so we can't go with that effort. I also ask for no driveway where it is currently located as it is dead center of my driveway and there will be headlights in my windows. I would like to see an access on the NW corner past my treeline for the school and church. The intersection of TWP1060 and RR152 you can hardly turn off the pavement cleanly without going off the curb into ditch with another vehicle waiting at the stop sign, it needs to be widened or upgraded. Now if there are school buses and individual traffic from kids being dropped off it will be full washboard.
