

Dear Council Members;

First of all I would like to thank you for giving me the time to make this presentation to you . I sincerely hope that you will be able to assist me in finding a solution to a problem our school staff and parents have identified.

As principal of St. Mary's School I am always concerned about the safety of all our students. Sixty - five percent of our students walk to school every day. And on a daily basis there is a high volume of large truck traffic that drive through Fort Vermilion on the river road and passes by the school.

This truck traffic poses a real potential hazard to the school and its students. As you know the sidewalk ends at the Catholic Church on the east and the Northern Retail store on the west . We have approximately 45 students who live in "Alberta Housing" on the East and another 27 students who live in the vicinity of the RCMP station. These students who walk to school , must eventually walk on the road to and from their residences. Winter time is particularly bad with icy roads, in summer it is gravel trucks.

I would strongly urge you, as Council, to designate Highway 88 as a truck route. The trucks that must come into Ft. Vermilion should take the most direct route.

Ensuring that there is a truck route would definitely minimize the potential danger to all individuals who reside in the hamlet, particularly younger children.

I am here to ask this council to be proactive and divert all heavy truck traffic to Highway 88 .
