## WALK IN DELEGATION

#### **Transfer Station Hauling Contract**

Larry Bateman and Patrick Bateman entered the meeting.

Larry Bateman reported he is being charged a \$25.00 fee each time he hauls to the Regional Landfill site after hours. Council discussed this problem and Bill Neufeld explained the contractor is to keep a list of bins loaded on each trip. The Authority is to be billed and they in turn will invoice each member for their portion of the cost. Any private pickups made by the contractor would be paid for by the contractor. The Town wrote a letter to the M.D., explaining the fee is to cover the cost of calling someone in to open the gate after hours.

Mr. Bateman said the weights are not measured consistently. The scales at the landfill site are in Imperial weights and everything else is in metric. He is losing approximately 200 pounds per tonne as a result of this. Clark McAskile will check with the Town and advise Mr. Bateman of their response.

Council tabled the balance of their discussion with the Bateman's until the Manager of Public Works is present.

#### 4 c) Paul Steffanson Re: Used Tires

Paul Steffanson presented a written proposal for "taking care of the old junk tire problem and reusing and recycling without incinerating and causing pollution." His proposal would take advantage of the \$4.00 per tire the Province is collecting and the incentives the Province is offering for new and creative ways of using old tires. He has a patent pending on a design for using tires for fences and could be in a position to pay people to take used tires to use in these fences.

Mr. Steffanson requested Council stockpile the tires at their transfer stations and not make any plans to haul them to the regional landfill site. His plan includes the option of users picking up the tires closer to home or right at the transfer station.

Council thanked Mr. Steffanson for his presentation and assured him they would support his proposal if it helped them dispose of used tires. Paul Steffanson left the meeting.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

Gary Mayhew entered the meeting at 11:45 a.m.

## **Revised Hauling Contract:**

Council and the Contractor agreed to amend the contract by adding "due to contractor negligence" at the end of number 5.

Betty Bateman asked Gary Mayhew to ask Pennzoil if they would look after placing a bin at the intersection of the Zama road and Highway #35.

Item k, - the off hours fee, will be negotiated and Gary Mayhew said it can be covered under extra work.

### **Road Bans**

Gary Mayhew said the road bans are covered in the contract and the only road that might cause a problem is the Pennzoil road. He will talk to Pennzoil and Gulf Oil who are the major users of the road. Gary Mayhew will add a clause to the effect that "this may include special haul permits".

#### **Standby Payment**

Mr. Bateman said he is not satisfied with the standby payment because it is a loan that the M.D. will recover at the end of the contract period. Judging by the amount of garbage being hauled out of Rainbow Lake, he feels the estimates for hauling were low and the actual amount will be much higher. Gary Mayhew will amend the contract agreement to reflect the change. Mr. Bateman said he was satisfied with this change.

Gary Mayhew will develop a form for the hauling and the Contractor will record how many bins are picked up at each site.

The meeting adjourned for lunch at 12:25 and reconvened at 1:30 p.m.

## COUNCILLORS CORNER

#### **Arly Roe**

Arly Roe asked for a report on the pedestrian crossing sign requested at the school in Fort Vermilion. Gary Mayhew replied he has met with Alberta Transportation and submitted a proposal to Alberta Power. The M.D. will be responsible for installing a pole. Mr. Mayhew has delegated this project to Kevin Morrison.

Arly Roe asked for an update on additional street lights for Fort Vermilion and Gary Mayhew reported he has delegated the street lights in the two hamlets to Kevin Morrison in Fort Vermilion and Dave Wiens in La Crete. Kevin Morrison will be asked to contact Arly Roe to discuss them.

Arly Roe asked for a report on the lighting proposed for the intersection of Highway 88 at Fort Vermilion and Gary Mayhew replied a letter had been sent to Alberta Transportation but no reply has been received. He will place this item on the Public Works Committee agenda.

#### **Betty Bateman**

Betty Bateman asked the Manager of Public Works to arrange to have the intersections and especially the 4 way stop, sanded in Zama. Gary Mayhew replied he will have Ray's Sand and Gravel do the work.

Buffalo Head Prairie in the next few years. Gary Mayhew replied it could take from three to five years to obtain approval for a landfill site in the M.D. He has heard that Environment will once again be responsible for the approval of all waste handling and Health would no longer be involved. Council agreed to discuss this topic with Environmental Protection Minister, Ty Lund, when he is in High Level next week.

Ernest Dyck asked when the dust control policy would be reviewed by Council. He would like to have the process and procedures on how decisions are made, reviewed by Council. Gary Mayhew replied that all dust control provided at the M.D.'s expense would be brought to Council for approval and not just the Public Works Committee. Ernest Dyck said he would like the first 1-1/2 miles of the Wadlin Lake connector (with Highway #697) treated for dust control.

Bill Neufeld asked if the use of potash tailings are being considered for dust control and Gary Mayhew replied no, but he will ask Dave Wiens to check into it.

Ernest Dyck asked if part of the Infrastructure Works grant has been allocated to the low level crossing as it is a dangerous spot and traffic in that area has increased. Clark McAskile replied they are obtaining costs on cutting down some of the steep grade.

#### **Ernest Dyck**

Ernest Dyck asked for clarification on which organizations are eligible for tax exemption. He said the seed cleaning plants are cooperatives and considering the difficulties the agriculture industry is experiencing, they should possibly get the same tax breaks as the golf courses. Clark McAskile will check on this because seed cleaning plants are a municipal responsibility.

## Reuben Derksen

Reuben Derksen questioned the financial statement presented to the Agricultural Service Board for the High Level Seed Cleaning Plant, saying it showed a deficit of \$180,000.00. Jay Lanti replied there is no deficit; it's the depreciation of the plant that has been set up by the accountants. Walter Sarapuk added that the report Reuben Derksen was referring to was a statement of revenue, not a financial statement, and the total accumulated depreciation is shown on it.

#### **Jake Peters**

Jake Peters reported he had been to Wadlin Lake recently and it appears none of the normal cleanup was done at the end of the season. He gave several examples of what should have been done prior to the end of the caretaker's contract. Clark McAskile will arrange to have this looked after. Jake Peters stated Council should have held a Wadlin Lake Committee meeting at the lake last year.

## **Betty Bateman**

Betty Bateman discussed an auditor's report on the Fort Vermilion Housing Authority and asked what action the Municipal District would take in response to the recommendations the report makes. Clark McAskile replied the audit report will be presented to the Mackenzie Housing Management Board at their first meeting on February 2.

Stan Smith was at the meeting as an observer and Betty Bateman invited him to speak about the Fort Vermilion Housing Authority. Stan Smith provided some background information and said he would recommend the Council appoint Addie Noble to serve on the Mackenzie Housing Management Board.
