Minutes of the regular meeting of the Council for the Municipal District of Mackenzie No. 23, held on June 13, 1995 in the Council Chambers, Provincial Building, High Level.

CALL TO ORDER

1. Reeve, Bill Neufeld called the meeting to order at 10:07 a.m.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

2. a) Bill Neufeld requested item 8. b) Airports, be added to the agenda.

The Municipal District of Mackenzie No. 23 adopt the agenda with additions.

DELEGATIONS

4.a) Ron Arnason, Husky Oil, Rainbow Lake

Bill Neufeld welcomed Ron Arnason to the meeting and Mr. Arnason introduced Bob Wier, representing Mobile Oil and Tim Zelter, representing Imperial Oil, who accompanied him from Rainbow Lake.

Ron Arnason stated he was attending the meeting as a tax payer and not as a representative of the Town of Rainbow Lake and he wanted to obtain some information from Council on their budget and the taxes levied for 1995.

He reviewed Husky Oil's assessment and tax levy for both 1994 and 1995 and asked Council for an explanation on the changes in the millrates, noting the overall tax increase for municipal purposes went from \$2.6 million in 1994 to \$5.2 million in 1995.

Council responded by explaining the general assessment conducted for 1994 was the first in eleven years and many ratepayers saw increases for improvements that were not picked up on the assessment roll earlier. In addition, this is the first year that properties were assessed at 100% of fair actual value where previous years assessments were at 65%. Bill Neufeld stated that the 1995 budget included a reserve account which would be used in part to lessen the increase in taxes expected in 1996 when the Province will use the M.D.'s new assessment figures for the first time in calculating the equalized assessment for the school requisition.

The delegation discussed the M.D.'s reserve account and asked Council how much was in reserves now and how much was being added from the 1995 levy. Council explained the problems they have in determining the exact amount of reserves on hand due to the transfer of the financial functions from the Province to the newly incorporated M.D. Bill Neufeld told the delegation the Department had advised the Council to build up their reserves in preparation for the decrease in grants from the Province over the next few years. Mr. Arnason said he agreed with the principle of building reserves but did not agree with doubling the amount of taxes collected for municipal purposes in one

year. Mr. Arnason asked Council if they would provide him with the detailed information on their reserves when they received the information from Edmonton and the Reeve replied, yes they would.

Council discussed the millrates for 1995, illustrating the majority of the ratepayers did not see large increases in their taxes and, in fact, many of the farmers saw a decrease in their total tax levy.

The delegation asked if they could review their 1994 assessment figures in the High Level Office and the Reeve welcomed them to do so.

Ron Arnason asked Council to give some consideration to amount of money they spend on road maintenance in other parts of the M.D. compared to roads in the Rainbow Lake area. He noted that approximately 40% of the tax base is industrial from the Rainbow Lake area and yet industry picks up all of the costs associated with maintaining the roads, including the road to the Lake which is used by many M.D. residents as a recreational area. Betty Bateman responded by saying the M.D. does not have any jurisdiction over License of Occupation roads and these costs have always been the responsibility of the license holder.

Ron Arnason questioned Council about their previous commitment to provide \$300,000.00 towards the capital costs of the new Recreation Centre in Rainbow Lake. Mr. Arnason recalled advising the I.D. Council at that time, that the New Town of Rainbow Lake would not be in a position to proceeded with construction if the commitment to funding from the I.D. was not made. He asked the M.D. Council to make a decision on the grant at their meeting today.

Ron Arnason asked for clarification on the M.D.'s policy to pay for hauling waste from their transfer stations to the Regional Landfill site in High Level. He said the M.D. residents in the Rainbow Lake area should receive the same benefit as residents in other areas. Betty Bateman replied that if the garbage was taken to an M.D. Transfer Station, then the M.D. would pay the hauling costs. Council wondered why this point was not raised during the planning stages for the waste handling system as Rainbow Lake had input into the planning.

Tim Zelter asked if he could obtain a copy of the 1995 High Level Ratepayers Meeting minutes and the Reeve replied the policy is to adopt the minutes prior to releasing them.

Bill Neufeld thanked the delegation for their presentation and they left the meeting.

4. b) Paul Steffanson, Re: ALL-WIN CANADIAN

Bill Neufeld welcomed Paul Steffanson to the meeting.

Mr. Steffanson said he was concerned about Council spending money on questionable items, specifically the staff training sessions conducted by ALL-WIN CANADIAN.

Mr. Steffanson alleged that Mr. Moddejong misrepresented himself to Council and the Council should have proof of who they are paying their accounts to. He said his concerns were that taxpayer's money should be spent locally and be legitimate and above board

Subdivision Inquiry

Mr. Steffanson asked for Councils comments regarding his plans to subdivide two parcels of land. One application will request a parcel of approximately 14 acres. This parcel is separated from the quarter section by the railroad and a standard five acre subdivision would leave a strip of land that would be awkward to farm. The 14 acres also includes two large dug outs.

Mr. Steffanson's second application, on a different quarter section, will be to subdivide an approximate 6.9 acre existing farm site. He asked Council if they would consider recommending approval of these two subdivisions even though they exceed the maximum five acre size. Council responded by saying they would consider the larger subdivisions if there were legitimate reasons for them.

Mr. Steffanson thanked Council for hearing his presentations and left the meeting.
