8. a) Bill Fedeyko, Re: Municipal Amalgamation

The following individuals entered the meeting as a delegation: Bill Fedeyko, Peter Chomiak and Lyman Brewster, M.D. residents, Jeff Deuchar, Rainbow Lake Town Council, Bob Walter and George Schmidt, High Level Town Council.

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The following individuals entered the meeting as ratepayers: Joe Rosenberger, Joe Ferdais, Frank Sokoloski, Maartin Braat and Frank Rosenberger. Grant Mann, Katrina Wilson and Peter Ernst entered the meeting during the discussion.

The Reeve welcomed the delegation and visitors to the meeting and introductions were made.

The following is a brief summary of the points raised during the discussion:



On behalf of the M.D. residents:

Bill Fedeyko addressed Council saying a small group of concerned citizens sent letters to and met with the Minister of Municipal Affairs over the past year and one of the items discussed was the concept of the amalgamation of the three municipalities in this region. In March, the group got together and sent a letter to the two Towns asking if they would consider this proposal and both Towns responded yes. The delegation was at the meeting to ask the M.D. Council to pass a motion similar to the Town's to determine if the group and Councils could go ahead with this concept. He added the group feels this will happen at some point in the future and the residents could be one step ahead of the times by studying it now.

Bill Fedeyko referred to the amalgamation of the City of Fort McMurray with the I.D. to form one municipality. This proposal would amalgamate two Towns and one M.D. with vast distances between the communities. The delegation asked for a commitment from the M.D. Council to investigate the idea, not to make a commitment to amalgamate.

On behalf of the Town Council of Rainbow Lake:

Jeff Deuchar reported the Town of Rainbow Lake considered the proposal and agreed to investigate the idea. He said he is convinced that this is the way government will be moving and feels the regional concept could work.

On behalf of the Town Council of High Level:

George Schmidt reported the Council for the Town of High Level were not sure if they really want to take the plunge and change but would sooner participate together with the other municipalities rather than be forced into amalgamation at a later date. He added it is normal for each municipality to protect their own autonomy, however many of the things we do can be shared and we can utilize our resources better. They are looking for tripartied support and to have questions such as should consultants be employed or would the Department of Municipal Affairs pay for a study or do we look at sharing this cost.

Are the Town Councils the only ones with information or is the general public involved, and the general public should tell their Councillors what they want.

The group is asking for a commitment to study the question only and they are not ready to have everyone involved at the present time. They recommend gathering some information first and presenting it later when they know what is involved. The question would probably be in the form of a petition or a plebiscite at a later date.

The M.D. Council has not received any information on this idea prior to reading about it in the local press and hearing it on the radio. Who are the people that spoke to the Minister?

Bill Fedeyko, Bill Jenkins, Clarence Lee, Lyman Brewster and Peter Chomiak were the initial group. After talking to the Minister, they have no more information than anyone else. Some costs would be involved for a study and if the M.D. is in support, they will talk to the Department and see if they will fund a study to compile information that is already there from previous studies.

What were the concerns this group of citizens had?

There were general concerns regarding the transition from I.D. to M.D. They talked to the Minister about them in a closed meeting and they are not ready to discuss those concerns at a public meeting. There is no hidden agenda or any secrets. The only question today is, what would you think of this concept?

M.D. residents were not consulted and the comments made on the radio by the Mayor of High Level, sounded like the M.D. had already discussed this. It included a statement that this could be a fall election platform. The Town of High Level should discipline their Mayor for making false statements.

The fact that comments were made in the press should not interfere or restrict the municipalities from looking forward or working together on this concept.

This is only a request to consider a concept. No one is pushing anything through and no one is in any position to say this is going anywhere. In any case, if you make a mistake in saying something prematurely, it was not intended to sound that way. The media sometimes gets things mixed up.

CKYL radio contacts the Town of High Level after each meeting and an apology was



extended if comments offended the M.D. Council. It is not just the Councils that will make the decision but all of the electorate.

Bill Fedeyko asked each individual Councillor for their opinion.

Jake L. Peters - no problem with looking at it.

Walter Sarapuk - in favor r of looking at it.

Arly Roe - we just incorporated and have a plate full now and don't see how we can get involved at this time. If you do a study and present the facts to this Council, then he can have some information to pass on to his ratepayers.

Bill Neufeld - would like to have a committee from each of the three Councils to see what were looking at right now.

Ernest Dyck - this is a new concept which he hasn't heard anything on previously and can not determine what his ratepayers are thinking of. We need time to give the ratepayers an opportunity to say what they want. Not willing to make a commitment right now.

Pauline Flett - ratepayers have asked if this is a good thing and she needs more information to be able to answer that question.

Reuben Derksen - have no information and would like to see the information from the two Towns before he can make up his mind if the M.D. should consider this proposal. The radio report surprised him and it sounded like the M.D. residents were in favour of the concept when in fact, they didn't know about it

Edward Froese - Why would the two Towns be interested in this unless there is something in it for them? Don't know.

Betty Bateman - willing to look at the pros and cons for both sides and haven't enough information at this time. The radio report surprised her and the Council just took one big step from I.D. to M.D. and now you want to put more on our plate.

Jay Lanti - the idea of the whole region being united sounds good and the request is just for more information and he's ready to make a motion to have a look at it.

Who would look at it? Representatives from the Councils and concerned citizens.

Bill Fedeyko said everyone wants more information and we won't get it if we don't go looking for it but we need the cooperation of the three Councils. The group does not have any answers other than to say Fort McMurray is a picture of what's happened. The radio reports take different parts of comments and put them together to make an interesting news story. He added he hopes that doesn't sway the Councils decision on whether or not to participate.

Bill Neufeld said he is concerned about the Minister's response to such a request and Bill Fedeyko said all they're doing is shopping.

Bill Neufeld suggested the two Towns should sit down with the M.D. first and see what kind of information we want.

Arly Roe added that it's not that they don't want to participate but they have so much to do right now that they haven't got time for more.

Jeff Deuchar said the Rainbow Lake Council had the same comments but if we do this together, it won't be that much for any one. It's an opportunity to take advantage of change. Maybe we can do better and he would sooner be on the end creating the change than be forced to change later.

Joe Ferdais said he was worried because no one knows anything about it and asked who's idea this is.

Jeff Deuchar said one of the Rainbow Lake Councillors presented it to their Council.

Reuben Derksen agreed it's a time of change and if the request was made a year from now, there would be a different response but right now, we have our hands full.

Jay Lanti said if the region is willing to be a region, then why are we running with three



separate local governments in one region. If we can make it work better, why not? All they're asking for is information.

Reuben Derksen asked what the problem was with the way things were going now and Lyman Brewster replied there is no problem but there is too much going on in too many places. The concept to join together is for the economic advantage. We aren't telling you to do something, just asking for something that makes common sense.

The Towns of Rainbow Lake and High Level prepare a proposal to present to the M.D. of Mackenzie, so they know what the proposal is, and when the information is made available, it be advertised so the M.D. residents are aware of what's happening and a plebiscite be held before we proceed.

AMENDMENT DENIED:

MOVER of MOTION 95-491, Jay Lanti, did not accept the amendment.

Discussion continued.

George Schmidt said the Towns were looking at a better way of operating the region and to find that out, they need the participation of the region. There is no advantage to the Towns to do a study in the absence of the M.D.

Lyman Brewster stated the M.D. Council should be concerned about the economics of the effort and suggested the M.D. Council should have their input in a feasibility study. At this point, there is nothing to offer the public for plebiscite.

Maartin Braat suggested a couple of people from each municipality sit down and talk about the investigation and Bill Fedeyko replied that first they need a willingness to look at it.

Joe Ferdais said it sounds like the group is asking the M.D. to pay for a consultant and he asked if anyone has information on what's in place now.

Bill Fedeyko replied that if the M.D. is not willing to participate, then its a dead issue.

Reuben Derksen withdrew his amendment to the motion.

Bill Neufeld asked why the delegation needs a motion from Council and Bill Fedeyko replied they want a public record for the commitment.

Bill Neufeld said this request was brought to Council without any advance preparation and Bill Fedeyko replied the basic information was made available for the agendas on Friday and he was told the agendas were prepared one week in advance.

Arly Roe asked Jay Lanti if he would withdraw his motion so Council could consider this first and Mr. Lanti replied there is no money or time involved; it is a commitment to just look at it at this point.

Bill Neufeld said the comments made by the Mayor of High Level on the radio had disturbed the ratepayers.

Betty Bateman said she would like to see an investigation on who is behind this and she wants to know what the ratepayers think about it. She said she was not saying we shouldn't look at it but up to now, we did not know what was going on.

Joe Ferdais said it sounds like High Level knows something they're not telling us.

Bill Fedeyko replied the Town of High Level did not initiate this proposal and if the people want someone to blame, it was he, along with Lyman Brewster, Clarence Lee and Peter Chomiak who first started working on this concept.

Lyman Brewster said 'investigation' is a bad word to use; it's a feasibility study. They want to see if it will work and want the consideration of the M.D. council to look at it. He said we have to start somewhere and there will always be representation from every area.

Betty Bateman noted that every time you do a study it costs money.

Lyman Brewster said he agrees there is money involved but we need to team up so it all goes in together. They want a strong enough support from this Council before they can go ahead.

Bill Neufeld said the M.D. Council wants the courtesy from the Town of High Level to talk to the M.D. before going on the radio. Other mayors would have done that first.

Lyman Brewster agreed and said if each Council gives their support, they can get a couple of people from each Council who can talk about it and then bring it back to the people.

Bill Fedeyko said maybe they started wrong but all they want is some time and commitment from the M.D. Councillors.

Bill Neufeld agreed and said the three Councils should sit down and talk about their expectations.

Bill Fedeyko said the only expectations are economics.

Reuben Derksen said it looks like they are bypassing the elected people and Bill Fedeyko replied they are just trying to facilitate.

Reuben Derksen said he had no problem sitting down and talking about it but it should come from the Councils and not people like Bill Fedeyko and his delegation.

Betty Bateman said you talked about it for a year and now, bang! we hear about it on the radio. Do you have a hidden agenda or what is your problem? She said she discussed it with Darcy Wilson from Rainbow Lake Council and didn't know anything about it before.

Bill Fedeyko asked if the Council wanted them to step out of it and Betty Bateman replied, no, she didn't say that but we need to get the Councils together.

Bill Fedeyko noted the Council had two letters of unanimous support from the two Towns and asked doesn't that mean anything?

Betty Bateman said Rainbow Lake had a lot of concerns too and the three Councils should get together and hash it out. She was not saying the concept is a bad concept.
