DELEGATION	7. d) <u>Petition for Paving of the Road from</u> <u>Tompkins General Store to Bluehills School</u>		
	Corney Teichreob, Corney Wolfe, Jake Driedger and Bill Siemens attended the meeting as a delegation to speak on the petition for paving the road near the Bluehills School. The Reeve welcomed them to the meeting and introductions were made.		
	Corney Teichroeb thanked Council for allowing them to make a presentation and said their request for paving started about three years ago when they first talked about paving Highway #697. Two years ago, then Minister of Transportation, Peter Trynchy, agreed that if the I.D. paid 50% of the paving costs, the Province would pay the other 50%. There is a real need for pavement to the school as the school was built very close to the highway and there is a problem with dust control. The petitioners are requesting two miles of the highway, from the Tompkins General Store to the Bluehills School be paved while the paving crew is in the area. They expect the project would be much cheaper if it could be done now.		
	Reuben Derksen entered the meeting at 10:23 a.m.		
	Gary Mayhew estimated the project would cost in the neighbourhood of \$300,000.00 and said if the project were to be an extension to the Transportation contract, the M.D. would be faced with paying the G.S.T. on the entire paying project. If it were to be a separate project, the G.S.T. would apply to the two miles only. If the total project were to be funded by the M.D., a separate agreement would have to be made with the Contractor.		

Mr. Teichroeb said the M.L.A told them the Transportation budget for the Province had already been set and if a proposal were to be made, it would have to indicate a very high level of local support and it may not be impossible to find funding this year.

Bill Neufeld asked when the Transportation paving contract would be done and Gary Mayhew replied possibly in sixty days.

Bill Neufeld informed the delegation that both the M.L.A. and the Minister of Transportation would be in High Level on August 10 and Council could discuss it with them at that time. He added that the Council had tried to include this two miles of paving as well as improvements to the Zama road in their original negotiations with Transportation before they took over the road authority but were not successful.

Council asked the Manager of Public Works to have the engineer prepare a detailed cost estimate and to ask the contractor for an estimate on his work, prior to the Minister's visit

#### 4.a) Tom Hoffman and Richard Chemago, High Level Forest Products

The Reeve welcomed Tom Hoffman and Richard Chemago to the meeting and introductions were made.

Tom Hoffman thanked Council for the opportunity to meet with them and discussed the hauling of timber from the High Level Forest Products mill to Brewster's mill in Red Earth. He said the company is facing major revenue losses because of this year's forest fires. The loss in the sale of chips alone is estimated at \$12 million and higher logging and sawing costs will have a big impact on their operations. High Level Forest Products are negotiating with Forestry on how they will handle the burnt wood.

Bill Neufeld told Mr. Hoffman the three local mills in the La Crete area are all short of wood and Council is concerned with timber leaving the area when these local mills need it. Mr. Hoffman replied he had met with two of the local mills and with meet with the third one soon to talk about the use of burnt timber. High Level Forest Products purchased local private timber during the last logging season at a high price, to keep the wood from being shipped to B.C. and as a result, they now have a surplus in their yard compared to other years. This surplus wood is what's being hauled to Brewster's mill. The log haul is being contracted to local truckers and they expect this haul alone will generate the purchase of ten new trailers. They will be using 7 axle trailers which will cause less damage to the road and result in more profit to the truckers. In addition to the revenue generated by the log haul, there are approximately twenty families who are M.D. residents, working at the Brewster Mill.

Mr. Hoffman explained that the sale of wood from one mill to another is a common practice and not unique in this instance. High Level Forest Products is currently purchasing wood from Hines Creek and this is strictly an inter-company swap of purchased wood from private land and not the movement of a crown resource.

In response to Council's questions, Mr. Hoffman explained the quotas purchased by the High Level Forest Products and the agreement in place that requires them to supply wood to La Crete Sawmills. 120,000 cubic meters will come from an agreement they have with the Little Red River Band. These agreements must be logistically sound so wood isn't passing in two directions on the same road.

Bill Neufeld told the delegation that Council's main concern is in keeping the timber in the local area and to be consistent with this, they wished to express their concerns to High Level Forest Products about the haul to Red Earth.

Tom Hoffman said they are exploring all options available to them now and they have made arrangements to talk to La Crete Sawmills and are committed to dealing with the local people.

Ernest Dyck asked if the winter logging plans were in place now and Mr. Hoffman replied they are working with Forestry and are trying to get the land base back into production. They will be planting one million trees because of the fire, 800,000 inside the burn and 200,000 adjacent to the burn. The fires have had a big effect on the Company and will continue to for a number of years. Sawing burned wood is a tough job and there are problems with personnel, health and safety issues and many other effects will be felt. The log haul to Red Earth is expected to start around August 7 and the trucks will haul on Primary Highways only. This haul could last for two or three months depending on road conditions, the weather, the condition of the trucks, etc.
