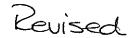

#### **BACKGROUND / PROPOSAL:**

Mackenzie County has received a request to close a portion of government road allowance lying west of NW 25-104-14-W5M. This road closure was submitted in conjunction with two subdivision applications for the lands lying west and northwest of the subject road allowance.

Bylaw 633/07 was presented to Council at the May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2007 meeting where it was tabled for more information.

# **OPTIONS & BENEFITS:**

Two subdivision applications have been submitted to the development department for the subdivision of the fragmented parcels of land lying to the east of Bear Creek, immediately west of the subject government road allowance (NW 25-104-14-5 and SW 36-104-14-5). Without a developed road the proposed subdivision adjacent to NW 25-104-14-5) does not have legal and physical access. By closing the road allowance adjacent to the west boundary of NW 24-104-14-5 the developer would be able to consolidate the proposed subdivision (the fragmented parcel east of the creek on NE 26-104-14-5) with NW 25-104-14-5 and thereby remove the need for access to each individual parcel as he is the current owner of NW 25 & SW 36-104-14-5.

The possible future consequences of closing road allowances should be considered very carefully as that portion of road allowance is taken out of the provincial road grid forever. If anytime in the future, even in 50 years or more, a road needs to be

constructed the municipality would have to purchase the land to construct the road. There are circumstances where it makes sense to do a road closure, one being if there is an existing forced road in close proximity. There is no road anywhere close to this road allowance and we don't know what kind of technology will be available in the future making this a feasible location to construct a road.

Without closing the road allowance the developer has two options. He can either:

- 1. proceed with the proposed subdivisions and construct a half mile of road to the north boundary of NE 26-104-14-W5M; or
- continue leasing the fragmented land on SE 36-104-14-W5M and NE 26-104-14-W5M and enter into a Road License Agreement with the County to farm the road allowance. Currently, he is farming the road allowance without an agreement with the County.

# **Options:**

Option 1

If Council determines that closing the subject road allowance could have detrimental consequences in the future, Council should defeat first reading of Bylaw 633/07.

Option 2

If Council determines that closure of the subject road allowance would have no bearing on future development of the road system then Council should proceed with first reading of Bylaw 633/07.

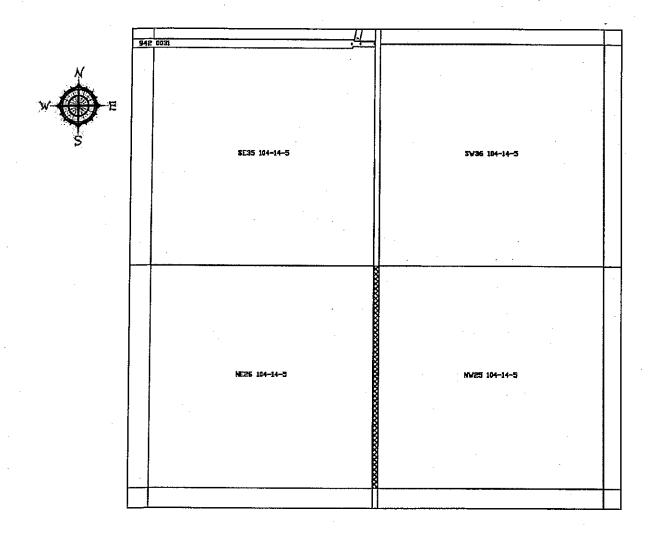

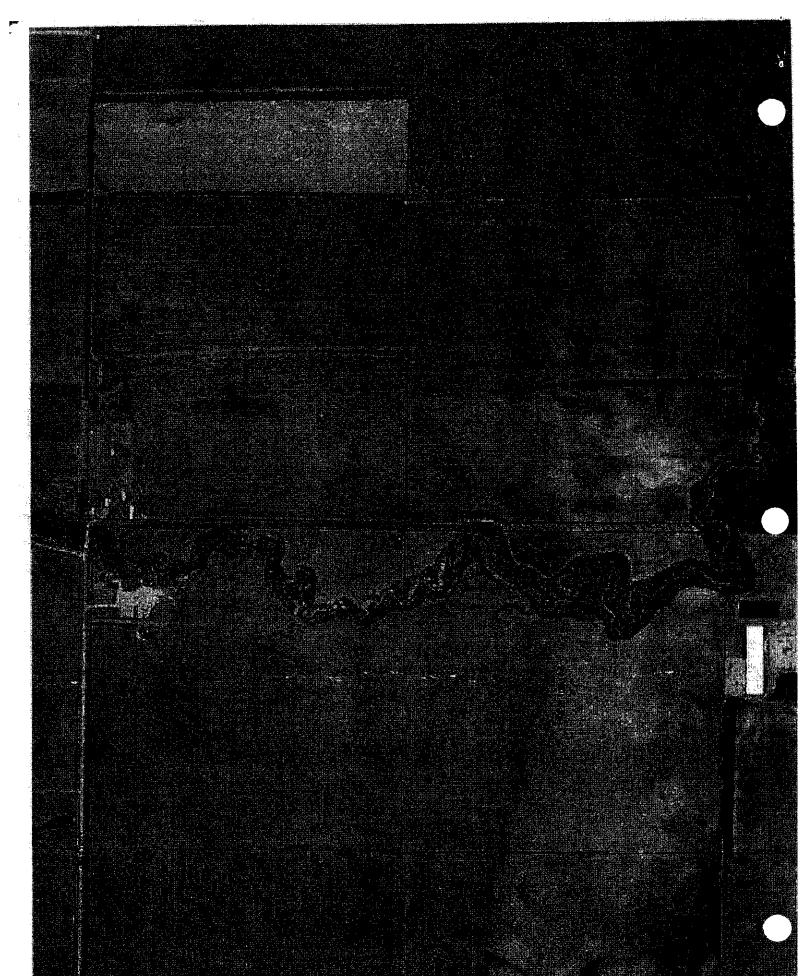

f) Development Permit Application 149-DP-07 Cornelius Bueckert; Home Based Business and Sign Plan 752 1580, Block 5, Lot 19; La Crete

Cornelius Bueckert was present to discuss his proposed development with the Municipal Planning Commission.

Mr. Bueckert has established a financial advisor business out of his residence. Most of the time he visits his clients in their homes instead of them coming to see him. Mr. Bueckert stated that he had an office in town but it was not feasible so he moved the business to his home, not realizing he required a permit. A three by eight foot sign attached to the fence in front of his residence advertises the business.

The sign exceeds the required dimensions within the County's Land Use Bylaw. Section 4.21.2 states "Signage for a home based business shall not exceed 1.1. square meters (12 square feet)".

Mr. Bueckert stated that his employers supplied the sign for the business and had given him the permission to place the sign.

The Municipal Planning Commission questioned if the sign could be cut in half or cut so that it would comply with the County's requirements.

Mr. Bueckert stated that he did not have a problem with cutting the sign. He would be unable to attach it to the house as there are trees in the front so the sign would not be visible at all. Mr. Bueckert questioned if the sign could still be attached to the fence.

Administration stated that the approval of the sign on the fence would be something that the Municipal Planning Commission would need to grant. The Municipal Planning Commission stated that they did not want to have the sign

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on the fence as the integrity of residential neighbourhood is lost. The Municipal Planning Commission suggested putting the sign above the garage doors or perhaps in between the garage doors.

Mr. Bueckert commented that a concern he would have with placing it on the garage is that people would not be able to see the sign until they were right in front of his property, but he is willing to put it above the garage doors.

## MOTION 07-170 MOVED by Manfred Gross

That Development Permit 149-DP-07 on Plan 752 1580, Block 5, Lot 19 in the name of Cornelius Bueckert, be approved with the following conditions:

- This permit may be revoked at any time, if, in the opinion of the Development Authority, the home based business has become detrimental or otherwise incompatible with the amenities of the neighborhood.
- The home based business shall not involve the storage of goods in the public view, a change in appearance of the residence or its accessory buildings.
- 3. Shall not employ any employees who do not reside on-site.
- 4. An unlighted sign to identify the home based business may be placed in a window or exterior of the house or garage and the sign shall not exceed 1.1 meters (12 square feet).
- 5. At all times, the privacy of the adjacent dwellings shall be preserved and the home based business shall not unduly offend the surrounding residents by way of excessive lighting, noise, traffic, congestion, late visitations by clients, etcetera.

- The total site area (lot) shall have a positive surface drainage without adversely affecting the neighbouring properties.

Paul stated that he had called the number provided and had talked to a female, uncertain if it was John Bueckert's wife, who said that Mr. Bueckert was not at home and would give him a message to call Paul back. Paul also sent an e-mail but had not received a response to date. Paul will continue to try contacting Mr. Bueckert again.

## Motion 07-105

Paul contacted Chris with Footner Forest Products. Chris stated that nothing had been finalized in regards to their definition of proximity. Footner Forest Products has involved their lawyers with this question and will be having a meeting shortly.

Administration stated that development within the proximity of sawmills is something that needs to be reviewed. Things like residential, roads, ashes and smoke is something that needs to be considered when approving a subdivision or development application.

#### Peter Rempel

Allowing replacements of Mobile Homes in Hamlet Residential – Commercial Transitional zones was discussed.

The Planning Supervisor reported that she had contacted Mr. Rempel to let him know that only a non-permanent addition to his existing residence would be allowed in this district. Mr. Rempel could submit a development permit application for a mobile home to see if the Municipal Planning Commission would approve it with a variance.

The Municipal Planning Commission commented that a new mobile home is just as easily moved as an addition. Furthermore, it will take years before commercial development reaches this area. This is something that should be allowed.

Administration stated that perhaps replacing a mobile home on an already existing parcel should be allowed. This would not work for a vacant parcel.

"Replacement of existing mobile homes with a new mobile home for developed parcels" will be added to the Land Use Bylaw amendments that will be presented to council after a full review of the Land Use Bylaw.

## Orange Town in Fort Vermilion

Currently this area is zoned as Hamlet Residential – Commercial Transitional.

The Municipal Planning Commission discussed rezoning this area as residential because it is next to the golf course.

The Municipal Planning Commission asked administration to bring a bylaw to Council to rezone this area to residential.

#### **Ball Diamond**

The Director of Planning will be attending the meeting on June 14, 2007.

Councillor Braun stated that the meeting date needs to be changed as Councillors and Administration have other commitments for this evening.

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The Director of Planning will talk to Brent with the Recreation Board about changing the meeting date.

## CAO REPORT TO COUNCIL July 10, 2007

This report is a brief overview of Mackenzie County major events, projects and general business affairs. The intent of this report is to keep Council current on the activities that we are engaged in or about to undertake.

## 1. Council Workshop

- This workshop was primarily dedicated to inter-municipal relations and development of a draft business plan.
- The process of completing the business plan and implementation of Council's approval plan is a critical step that needs to be kept active and moving forward.
- I strongly recommend Council continue to engage Activation Analysis to complete the process and also to conduct a Council orientation after the October elections.

## 2. Major Projects

### a. Highway 88

- There is a significant shift in provincial policy which <u>may</u> allow the County to manage or orchestrate the completion of pavement on Highway 88 over the next 3 to 5 years.
- I recommend Council approve the Reeve, Deputy Reeve, and Chief Administrative Officer chasing this project and bring a plan back for Council's approval.
- I estimate the County's cost to develop this project at \$75,000.00.
   Once the project is more clearly defined and the key partners are selected I will be able to estimate overall County cost and involvement.

#### b. Resource Roads

- La Crete 99<sup>th</sup> street and the 697 degazeted access roads project have been tendered and will close on July 25, 2007.
- Zama Tower Road project will be tendered in late July and close in August 2007.
- Recommend that Council approve the 2008 resource roads at the July 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.

#### c. La Crete South Access

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 General gravelling is underway and if Council members have any concerns please advise.

## 3. Inter-municipal Stuff

- We certainly have some challenges here and Council's final decision will have a long term political and monetary impact.
- Recommend we retain the service of Activation Analysis and follow their advice of July 9, 2007.

In summary, we are moving forward on many fronts and at the moment I think we are in control of our destiny. Thank you and please review the attachments and advise of any action you may wish.

Footner Forest Products Ltd. has received its 2007 tax invoice from the Municipal District of Mackenzie which includes an approximate 9% increase over those taxes assessed in 2006. This increase, amounting to approximately \$173,000, is a very significant expense to FFP in a time when it has been required to take extreme measures to reduce operating costs to remain viable.

FFP operates in an industry that is currently facing many challenges which severely affect the earning potential of our facility.

- Reduction in product demand resulting from reduced US Housing Starts The Crow's
  Canadian Panel Report newsletter states that new construction in the US is down 16%
  from this time in 2006. It reports that the industry is 'feeling the impacts of tighter lending
  standards on current home sales as well as cancellations'. It also notes that the housing
  market is not projected to turn around until some time next year. As a result, the OSB
  industry must deal with a large void in the demand for its product, resulting in very soft
  market pricing.
- Product Surplus To emphasize the impact of the downturn in housing starts, the OSB
  market is also experiencing an oversupply with a large number of new mills and
  competitors coming on line. This surplus production also has a negative impact on OSB
  sales prices, which are currently at record lows. Forest products industry analysts
  forecast that a turnaround to profitability will likely not occur until 2009 or 2010;
- Reduction in profit margin due to relative strength of the Canadian dollar to the US dollar

   Approximately 90% of our product is exported to the US. Varying economists have differing projections about the future of the Canadian dollar, but all seem to agree that the dollar will have a significant impact on the profitability of exporting companies. If parity between the US and the Canadian dollar is achieved, Canadian exports will be 10% more expensive than they are now to our customers. There are some analysts which don't think that this is out of the question.



In light of these severely depressed market conditions, the OSB industry continues to see a steady succession of closures. Each day FFP and its shareholders must review its operations relative to the market and make the decision to continue to manufacture product or to curtail operations. The main factor for consideration is FFP's ability to keep its costs at an absolute minimum. FFP's northern location places it at an immediate cost disadvantage due to the higher costs of labor, and transportation costs of both raw materials and finished goods. To achieve success, it is essential that FFP has the support of its stakeholders, such as the MD.

Bill, we appreciate you taking the time to understand the challenges currently facing FFP. Any advice on the alternatives available to FFP relating to this matter would be greatly appreciated. We welcome any opportunity to mitigate our costs and weather these difficult times.

The province recently announced \$285 million in new funding in response to the recommendations brought forward through the Alberta Affordable Housing Task Force. High-growth communities will receive a total of \$143 million in support of affordable housing to meet growth pressures within their community.

An additional \$68 million is available to other communities that can demonstrate a need for affordable housing and have identified a suitable project. Communities that received funding from the \$143 million initiative, but received less than \$3 million, are also eligible to apply for additional funding. Municipalities can apply through a Request for Proposal process until August 31, 2007. Neil Shelly, Executive Director, Alberta Forest Products Association (AFPA) provided a presentation and update of AFPA. The AFPA is a private, non-profit industry organization, representing 62 member companies that manufacture lumber, panelboard, pulp and paper and secondary manufactured wood products in the province. The forest products industry is Alberta's third largest manufacturing industry and second largest export manufacturing industry, which provides significant economic contributions to more than 50 provincial communities. Key issues of Mr. Shelley's presentation were the need to creating competitive pricing and opportunities within the lumber industry. This could be done in part my improving the efficiency of the regulations, improving the transportation system, especially rail; and exploring new opportunities in marketing and product development. Mr. Shelly encouraged those present to talk to their MLA's and government contact to lobby for positive changes within the lumber industry.

Rick Nicholson, Mayor, Town of Fairview expressed his concern over water resources in the north as this is one of the last resources that has not been taken away by other jurisdictions such as the United States. Mayor Nicholson asked that the Northern Alberta Development Council research what water studies are currently ongoing throughout the province and provide an inventory of water supplies.

**Bill Neufeld, Reeve, County of Mackenzie** requested support from the group to lobby the provincial government and Alberta Infrastructure and Transportation in the completion of paving the final 220 kms of Highway 88, from Slave Lake north to Fort Vermilion. The road can be used in the winter but is not as usable during the summer months.

It was **MOVED** by Wayne Ayling **THAT** prior to support from the Mayors and Reeves group, the County of Mackenzie circulate a copy of the economic impact study that was undertaken by the County.

George deRappard, Senior Association, Activation Analysis Group, provided a presentation on the Commuter Air Access Network of Alberta (CAANA) which is an association of communities, businesses and people committed to improving air access among all regions of Alberta and to improving access to Alberta's capital city by way of the Edmonton City Centre airport. The existing 560 m horizontal curve on the South La Crete Access is being re-aligned. All materials within the existing curve shall be obliterated and utilized for construction including, but not limited to, existing asphalt, granular base course and embankment material in the construction of the new grade or as directed by the Consultant.

The estimated quantity for obliteration of the existing paved roadway is 17,000 cubic metres which includes the obliteration and disposal of existing asphalt, granular base course, and embankment materials. The contractor shall utilize the majority of this material for embankment required for the construction of the new alignment. The estimated short fall of 14,000 cubic meters of common excavation can be obtained from the obliterated roadway. The remaining approximate 3,000 cubic meter road core surplus material shall be left in place: i.e. landscaped, topsoiled, seeded, and incorporated into the reclamation of the obliterated existing curve. 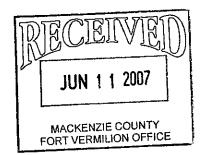

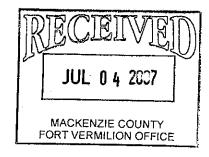

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## BYLAW NO. 634/07 BEING A BYLAW OF THE

#### **MACKENZIE COUNTY**

(hereinafter referred to as "the County")

#### IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

This bylaw authorizes the Council of the County to incur indebtedness by the issuance of debenture(s) up to a maximum of \$1,943,245, for the purpose of financing the upgrade of the Zama Wastewater System.

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the County has decided to issue a by-law pursuant to Section 258 of the *Municipal Government Act* to authorize the financing, undertaking and completion of the upgrade of the Zama Wastewater System as approved by Council in capital expenditures; and

WHEREAS, plans and specifications have been prepared and the total cost of the project is estimated to be \$7,772,982; and

WHEREAS, in order to complete the project it will by necessary for the County to borrow the sum of \$1,943,245 for a period not to exceed 10 years, from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution, by the issuance of debentures and on the terms and conditions referred to in this bylaw; and

WHEREAS, The estimated lifetime of the project financed under this by-law is equal to, or in excess of 10 years; and

WHEREAS, the principal amount of the outstanding debt of the County at December 31, 2006 is \$7,203,745 and no part of the principal or interest is in arrears; and

WHEREAS, all required approvals for the project have been obtained and the project is in compliance with all *Acts* and *Regulations* of the Province of Alberta.

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY DULY ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That for the purpose of completing the upgrade of the Zama Wastewater System the sum of **One Million Nine Hundred Forty Three Thousand and Two Hundred Forty Five Dollars (\$1,943,245)** be borrowed from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution by way of debenture on the credit and security of the County at large.
- 2. The proper officers of the County are hereby authorized to issue debenture(s) on behalf of the County for the amount and purpose as authorized by this by-law, namely the upgrade of the Zama Wastewater System.
- 3. The County shall repay the indebtedness according to the repayment structure in effect, namely annual or semi-annual equal payments of combined principal and interest instalments not to exceed TEN (10) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing, and not to exceed TEN (10) percent.
- 4. The County shall levy and raise in each year municipal taxes sufficient to pay the indebtedness.
- The indebtedness shall be contracted on the credit and security of the County.
- 6. The net amount borrowed under the by-law shall be applied only to the project specified by this by-law.
- 7. This by-law comes into force on the date it is passed.

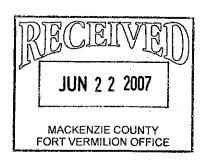

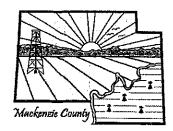

#### 1. Members

Bylaw 638/07 Municipal Reserve Closure

Part of Plan 062 4963, Block 1, Lot 11MR (SW 13-106-15-W5M)

(La Crete Rural)

### BACKGROUND / PROPOSAL:

Mackenzie County has received a request to close a portion of a municipal reserve lot lying within the northerly portion of SW 13-106-15-W5M. This municipal reserve closure was submitted in conjunction with a subdivision application for the lands lying to the north of the municipal reserve lot. The approved subdivision requires a portion of the municipal reserve lot in order to provide access to the subdivision. This matter was presented to the Municipal Planning Commission at their May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2007 meeting where it received approval subject to the closure of a portion of the municipal reserve lot.

#### **OPTIONS & BENEFITS:**

The municipal reserve on SW 13-106-15-W5M was provided in order to serve as a buffer between the rural country residential development and its neighbouring agricultural district. The portion proposed for closure is immediately adjacent to the internal subdivision road and intersects the point of Lot 12. The landowner of Lot 12 does not have any concerns with regard to the proposed closure.

The access to the subdivision on the NW 13-106-15-W5M has been approved at the center of the curve of the internal subdivision road. This location was reviewed by the Roads Department to ensure that adequate visibility was provided to traffic leaving or entering the approved subdivision and the existing residential subdivision. The access location was found to provide good visibility and no traffic safety problems were perceived.
