Comments:

As a part of its mandate, the Fort Vermilion Mackenzie County Enhanced Unit has been focused on the identification and arrest of prolific offenders in our communities. This work spanned the creation of data tracking tools to associate gathered information to individuals on warrant to the development of relationships within out communities to inform our enforcement activities. Open source investigation techniques have also played a key role in the successes of this initiative.

With this targeted crime reduction approach, some 62 arrest warrants were executed this past quarter, the most notable of which was Jerry Ivor DOr - an individual on warrant since 2018 with some 49 outstanding charges who was arrested upon the execution of a fenny warrant on a residence in John DOr Prarie. This next quarter, the work of the Enhanced Unit will include a warrant round up initiative.

Guest speakers attended the event which included a Barbeque, Tipt raising, bannok making with an elder, eagle feather blessing, smudging and stories. The event was well received by the Community.

Plans are underway in both Fort Vermilion and Fox Lake to hold formal community consultations in the Fall and in the new year.

While "technically" next quarter, RCMP members engaged with the Little Red River Cree Nation (LRRCN) Mamawi Awasis Society that provides preventative and protective services in the least intrusive and culturally appropriate manner the LRRCN to participate in a "Walk to Remember" the victims and survivors of Residential Schools. The presence of the RCMP was welcomed and children present interacted with the members asking all manner of questions.

Members of the Fort Vermilion and Fox Lake Detachments have been busy locating persons and executing warrant tasks in the Detachment area. The Mackenzie County Enhanced Unit has been in the forefront of this initiative. Comments:

It was the expectation that training would resume this quarter to allow members to be RADAR/LASER trained to enhance traffic enforcement. However, the resurgence of COVID-19 in AB has resulted in the delay of these plans. Despite this, members have been actively engaged in traffic safety education and enforcement. Of note:

July 9th - Members conducted a check stop in the area of Highway 58 and Highway 697 focused on document (registration, insurance) checks and speed enforcement. On August 10th, during the first evening of the La Crete Rodeo, members conducted check stops and roving traffic stops post event focused on impaired drivers and police visibility.

This past quarter saw 236 reports of traffic violations / incidents, of which 44 were cleared by charge and 72 cleared otherwise (warnings, IRS, etc.)

This next quarter will see a focus on "Operation Impact 2021" - a public awareness campaign set to take place over the Thanksgiving weekend. The focus will be on education and

Given current restrictions in the local schools, progress on the P.A.R.T.Y initiative has stalled. To help offset this, members have taken the opportunity to seek out and engage with young drivers to provide harm reduction education. Of note, on Sept 25th, Cst. Dragomir engaged with 3 separate groups of youth in La Crete at the Co-Op parking lot. Some 10 vehicles were checked with all operators having valid drivers licenses, insurance and registration, and no indicia of alcohol. The member spoke with them about the dangers of drinking and driving and touched on a recent impaired driving incident that resulted in the death of a youth and serious injury to another on Hwy 697. During this quarter, one of the two qualified IWT operators was away on leave and also training. This said, Cst. MASON and Sgt. BUTT did make a patrol of the Peace River to provide enforcement, visibility and education during River Daze following reports of boaters not respecting the small vessel regulations (right of way, etc.). Patrols were made and ~ 5 contacts made. Of those stopped, all were compliant with regulations.

During a subsequent patrol of the boat launch area, a boat was observed being operated in an unsafe manner by a member on patrol. A subsequent investigation found that the operator was impaired. One watercraft was seized and the operator issued an IRS suspension for operating a motorized watercraft while impaired.

Housing has been secured for two with another two residences being acquired. Monthly meetings continue to be had with Mackenzie County. One check stop was held during Operation Impact and another two were held on the National Impaired Driving Day of December 4th (one in Fort Vermilion and another in Fox Lake). 





1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose of RFP

1.1.1 **Mackenzie County** seeks proposals from interested parties for the following:

Assessment Services

Proposals are to include a list of options. It is the Assessment Firm's responsibility to identify any inability to meet the requirements specified in this RFP.

- 1.1.2 Mackenzie County (the "County") is the sole and legal owner.
- 1.1.3 If the County receives a proposal acceptable to it, the County will select one (1) or more Assessment Firms who submitted a proposal (the "Firm") with whom the County, in its sole and unfettered discretion, may negotiate the terms of a contract.

1.2 Submission of RFP

1.2.1 Firms shall submit their Proposal in a sealed envelope marked "Request for Proposal for **Mackenzie County Assessment Services**" (the "Proposals") on or before 4:30:00 p.m. (Mountain Standard Time) on May 24, 2022 (the "RFP Closing Time") to:

No mailed, faxed or electronically submitted Proposals will be accepted by the County. Proposals sent by courier and/or delivered in person will be accepted by the County.

- 1.2.2 Proposals will be opened publically at the regular council meeting May 25, 2022 at 11:00:00 a.m. following the RFP Closing Time. No Proposal(s) submitted after the RFP Closing Time will be accepted.
- 1.2.3 Each Firm may only submit one proposal.

1.2.4 Any inquiries respecting this RFP should be directed to:

- 1.2.5 Each Firm shall designate a person to whom any additional information may be obtained. The name and contact information is to be communicated to the County's designated contact person indicated in paragraph 1.2.4 above noted.
- 1.2.6 The County is under no obligation to respond to any inquiry submitted to it in respect of this RFP.
- 1.2.7 If the County, in its sole and unfettered discretion, determines that a written response to an inquiry is warranted, a written response will be prepared and distributed to all Firms who have requested a copy of this RFP and completed the acknowledgment form. Such written response(s) will be issued in the form of an addendum to this RFP, and will be deemed to be part of this RFP.
- 1.2.8 No inquiry submitted to the County will be responded to after **May 24, 2022.**

1.3 General Conditions Applicable to this RFP

1.3.1 Appendices and Addenda

The appendices to this RFP and any subsequent addenda are incorporated into and form part of this RFP. The information and data contained in any appendices and any subsequent addenda may form the basis upon which a contract engagement will be entered into the Contract will be entered with the County.

1.3.2 **Disclaimer of Liability and Indemnity**

By submitting a Proposal, a Firm agrees:

- 1.3.2.1 to be responsible for conducting its own due diligence on data and information upon which its Proposal is based;
- 1.3.2.2 that it has fully satisfied itself as to its rights and the nature extended to the risks it will be assuming;
- 1.3.2.3 that it has gathered all information necessary to perform all of its obligations under its Proposal;
- 1.3.2.4 that it is solely responsible for ensuring that it has all information necessary to prepare its Proposal and for independently verifying and informing itself with respect to any terms or conditions that may affect its Proposal;

- 1.3.2.5 to hold harmless the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, advisors or partnering entities in this undertaking, and all of their respective successors and assigns, from all claims, liability and costs related to all aspects of the RFP process;
- that it shall not be entitled to claim against the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, insurers, agents, advisors, and partnering entities in this undertaking on grounds that any information, whether obtained from the County or otherwise (including information made available by its elected officials, officers, employees, agents or advisors), regardless of the manner or form in which the information is provided is incorrect or insufficient;
- 1.3.2.7 that the County will not be responsible for any costs, expenses, losses, damages or liability incurred by the Firm as a result of, or arising out of, preparing, submitting, or disseminating a Proposal, or for any presentations or interviews related to the Proposal, or due to the County's acceptance or non-acceptance of a Proposal; and
- 1.3.2.8 to waive any right to contest in any proceeding, case, action or application, the right of the County to negotiate with any Firm for the Contract whom the County deems, in its sole and unfettered discretion, to have submitted the Proposal most beneficial to the County and acknowledges that the County may negotiate and contract with any Firm it desires.

1.3.3 No Tender and no Contractual Relationship

The Firm acknowledges and agrees that this procurement process is a Request for Proposal and is not a tendering process. It is part of an overall procurement process intended to enable the County to identify a potential successful Firm. The submission of a Proposal does not constitute a legally binding agreement between the County and any Firm. For greater certainty, by submission of its Proposal, the Firm acknowledges and agrees that there will be no initiation of contractual obligations or the creation of contractual obligations as between the County and the Firm arising from this RFP or the submission of a Proposal.

Further, the Firm acknowledges that a Proposal may be rescinded by a Firm at any time prior to the execution of the Contract.

1.4 Discretion of the County

Notwithstanding any other provision of this RFP to the contrary, the provisions in this Section 1.4 prevail, govern and override all other parts of this RFP. The County is not bound to accept any Proposal. At any time prior to execution of the Contract, the County may, in its sole and unfettered discretion, or for its own convenience, terminate the procurement process. All of this may be done with no compensation to the Firms or any other party.

The County reserves the right, in its sole and unfettered discretion, to:

- 1.4.1 utilize any ideas or information contained in any of the Proposals for its sole use and benefit without making payment or otherwise providing consideration or compensation to any Firm or any other party;
- 1.4.2 negotiate the specific contractual terms and conditions, including but not limited to the fee or;
- 1.4.3 waive any formality, informality or technicality in any Proposal, whether of a minor and inconsequential nature, or whether of a substantial or material nature;
- 1.4.4 receive, consider, and/or accept any Proposal, regardless of whether or not it complies (either in a material or non-material manner) with the submission requirements or is the lowest priced proposal, or not accept any Proposal, all without giving reasons;
- 1.4.5 determine whether any Proposal meets the submission requirements of this RFP; and
- 1.4.6 negotiate with any Firm regardless of whether or not that Firm is the Firm that has received the highest evaluation score, and
- 1.4.7 negotiate with any and all Firms, regardless of whether or not the Firm has a Proposal that does not fully comply, either in a material or non-material way with the submission requirements for the RFP or any requirements contained within this RFP.

1.5 **Selection**

Selection of the successful Firm, if any, is at the sole and unfettered discretion of the County.

1.6 **Disqualification**

The failure to comply with any aspect of this RFP (either in a material way or otherwise), shall render the Firm subject to such actions as may be determined by the County, including disqualification from the RFP process, suspension from the RFP process and/or imposition of conditions which must be complied with before the Firm will have its privilege of submitting a Proposal reinstated.

1.7 Representations and Warranties

- 1.7.1 The County makes no representations or warranties other than those expressly contained herein as to the accuracy and/or completeness of the information provided in this RFP.
- 1.7.2 Firms are hereby required to satisfy themselves as the accuracy and/or completeness of the information provided in this RFP.
- 1.7.3 No implied obligation of any kind by, or on behalf of, the County shall arise from anything contained in this RFP, and the express representations and

warranties contained in this RFP, and made by the County, are and shall be the only representations and warranties that apply.

1.7.4 Information referenced in this RFP, or otherwise made available by the County or any of its elected officials, officers, employees, agents or advisors as part of the procurement process, is provided for the convenience of the Firm only and none of the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and advisors warrant the accuracy or completeness of this information. The Firm is required to immediately bring forth to the County any conflict or error that it may find in the RFP. All other data is provided for informational purposes only.

2.0 PROJECT OVERVIEW & SCOPE OF WORK

Please refer to Schedule "A".

3.0 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

The County reserves the right, but is not required, to reject any Proposal that does not include the requirements.

3.1 **Description of the Proposal**

- 3.1.1 Proposals shall include the legal name, address and telephone numbers of the individual, the principals of partnerships and/or corporations comprising the Firm, and in the case of partnerships or corporations, the individual who will be the representative of the partnership or corporation.
- 3.1.2 The assessment team must be a core of professionals who are competent to deal with a variety of assessments from farmland to commercial and residential, to oil and gas facilities, to electric facilities, to specialized wood products. In addition, the assessment firm must be able to defend these assessments before an Assessment Review Board, Municipal Government Board and/or a Court of Law.
- 3.1.3 Firms must provide Resume(s) for the Assessor(s) who will be assigned to provide the services. Resumes must include:
 - designation or level of certification
 - background and training
 - years of experience
 - experience in similar sized municipalities
- 3.1.4 Firms Proposals must include any agencies or organizations to which work will be sub-contracted. If this is applicable, the same information that is required above will be required for the sub-contracting agency or organization.

3.1.5 The Firm shall include a minimum of three (3) municipal references with their Proposal package. References shall include the name of the municipality, a contact person, complete with title, phone number and email address. The references must reflect municipalities for whom similar services were provided.

3.2 **Execution of the Proposal**

Proposals shall be properly executed in full compliance with the following:

- 3.2.1 Proposals and the pricing form attached as **Schedule "B"**, must be signed by the representative for the Firm;
- 3.2.2 if the Proposal is made by a corporation, the full name of the corporation shall be accurately printed immediately above the signatures of its duly authorized officers and the corporate seal shall be affixed;
- 3.2.3 if the Proposal is made by a partnership, the firm name or business name shall be accurately printed above the signature of the firm and the Proposal shall be signed by a partner or partners who have authority to sign for the partnership;
- 3.2.4 if the Proposal is made by an individual carrying on business under a name other than his own, his business name together with the individual's name shall be printed immediately above its signature; and
- 3.2.5 if the Proposal is made by a sole proprietor who carries on business in his own name, the proprietor shall print his name immediately below his signature.

4.0 MANDATORY SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Documents to be Submitted with the Proposal

At the time of the submission of its Proposal, the Firm shall provide the following:

- 4.1.1 Firm's experience with similar projects.
- 4.1.2 List of Firm's references.
- 4.1.3 Proof of Firm's Workers Compensation account in good standing at the time of Proposal submission;
- 4.1.4 A copy of all licenses, certifications, qualification issued by the relevant authorities, which the Firm requires in order to perform all contractual duties as described by the RFP.

4.2 Insurance to be carried by Successful Firm

At the time of the submission of its Proposal, the Firm shall provide evidence of insurance coverage as follows:

- 4.2.1 standard automobile, bodily injury and property damage insurance providing coverage of at least **TWO MILLION** (\$2,000,000.00) **DOLLARS** inclusive and in respect of any one claim for the injury to or death of one or more persons or damage to or destruction of property;
- 4.2.2 a comprehensive general liability insurance policy providing coverage of at least TWO MILLION (\$2,000,000.00) DOLLARS inclusive and in respect of any one claim for injury to or death of any one or more persons or damage to or destruction of property. Coverage to include:
 - 4.2.2.1 non-owned automobiles;
 - 4.2.2.2 independent subcontractors;
 - 4.2.2.3 contractual liability including this Agreement.
- 4.2.3 Firm's Compensation coverage for all employees, if any, engaged by the Work in accordance with the laws of the Province of Alberta;
- 4.2.4 Employer's liability insurance respecting employees, if any, of the Firm with limits of liability of not less than TWO MILLION (\$2,000,000.00) DOLLARS per employee for each accident, accidental injury or death of an employee or any subcontractor engaged by the Firm; and
- 4.2.5 such other insurance as the County may from time to time reasonably require.

The Firm shall cause all insurance coverage maintained by the Firm in accordance with this RFP, except for errors and omissions coverage (if required), to name the County and any other party designated by the County as an additional insured and to contain a severability of interests or cross liability clause. The Firm shall cause all insurance coverage to provide that no such insurance policy may be cancelled without the insurer providing no less than thirty (30) days' written notice of such cancellation to the County. The Firm shall, upon the request of the County, furnish written documentation, satisfactory to the County, evidencing the required insurance coverage. The cost of all of the insurance required to be held by the Firm as set forth herein shall be borne by the Firm.

4.3 Two (2) copies of the proposal shall be submitted to Mackenzie County.

5.0 EVALUATION

- 5.1 After the RFP Closing Time, the County will open, review and evaluate all the Proposals received based upon the information supplied by the Firms in accordance with the submission requirements of this RFP.
- 5.2 In evaluating the Proposals received, the County will consider all of the criteria listed see **Schedule C** for scoring, and the County will have the sole and unfettered discretion to award up to the maximum number of points for each criteria as listed below. By submitting a Proposal, the Firm acknowledges and agrees that the

County has, and is hereby entitled to exercise, the sole and unfettered discretion to award the points for the evaluation of the noted criteria.

5.3 By submitting a Proposal, each Firm acknowledges and agrees that it waives any right to contest in any legal proceedings the decision of the County to award points in respect of the criteria noted below (the "Evaluation Criteria"). Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

The County may select a Firm with the highest, or not necessarily the highest, points with whom to negotiate the contract. Points will be assigned for each criteria based on the information provided in the Firm's submission. Scoring will be consistently applied by the County's evaluation team through the use of the scoring matrix noted in Schedule "C".

5.4 At all times, the County reserves the right to seek written clarification regarding a Proposal from a Firm. Such clarification shall be deemed an amendment to such Firm's Proposal.

6.0 OTHER

6.1 **Period Open for Consideration**

The Proposals received shall remain irrevocable for a period of thirty (30) days following the RFP Closing Date in order to allow for the County to undertake the evaluation of the Proposals received and to undertake the negotiations as provided for herein.

6.2 Information Disclosure and Confidentiality

All documents submitted to the County will be subject to the protection and disclosure provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* ("FOIP"). FOIP allows persons a right of access to records in the County's custody or control. It also prohibits the County from disclosing the Firm's personal or business information where disclosure would be harmful to the Firm's business interests or would be an unreasonable invasion of personal privacy as defined in sections 16 and 17 of FOIP. Firms are encouraged to identify what portions of their Proposals are confidential and what harm could reasonably be expected from its disclosure. However, the County cannot assure Firms that any portion of the Proposals can be kept confidential under FOIP.

6.3 **Independent Determination**

A Proposal will not be considered by the County if it was not arrived at independently without collusion, consultation, communication or agreement as to any matter, such as prices, with any other Firm.

6.4 **Documents**

All documents submitted by a Firm shall become the property of the County upon being presented, submitted, or forwarded to the County. Should any documents be submitted electronically, notwithstanding the prohibition on same contained elsewhere in this RFP, then their content and the media they are contained in shall also become the property of the County upon their being presented, submitted or forwarded to the County.

6.5 Agreement on Internal Trade and New West Partnership Trade Agreement

The provisions of the Agreement on Internal Trade, Part IV, Chapter Five – Procurement and Annex 502.4, ("AIT") and the New West Partnership Trade Agreement ("NWPTA") apply to this Proposal.

6.6 Other Conditions

The Firm is fully responsible for obtaining all information required for the preparation of its Proposal. The County is not responsible for undertaking any investigations to assist the Firm.

6.7 Law and Forum of Proposal

The law to be applied in respect of this RFP shall be the law of the Province of Alberta and all civil actions commenced in relation to this RFP shall be adjudicated by the Courts of the Province of Alberta. By submitting a Proposal, the Firm is deemed to have agreed to attorn to the jurisdiction of the Courts of the Province of Alberta.

Assessment Services PROJECT OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF WORK

Mackenzie County - Assessment Services

- **1.** The RFP is to obtain assessment services as a part of Mackenzie County's property taxation process
- 2. Serve as a liaison between Mackenzie County and the residents on matters dealing with property assessments; including the management of assessment inquiries in regards to assessment via phone calls or email communication.
- **3.** Provide annual assessment open houses within the hamlets after tax combined assessment and tax notices have been mailed; to provide property assessment information and to answer questions taxpayers may have.
- 4. Provide and maintain comprehensive computer assisted mass appraisal (CAMA) software and all subsequent hardware, at the Firm's sole cost to hold assessment records. Any data conversion is also at the Firm's sole cost and the annual assessment transfer must be in a format compatible with Mackenzie County's software.
- **5.** The Firm shall conduct inspections and investigations as required, and prepare Assessments of all those lands and improvements contained within the Municipality's jurisdiction.

 - a) properties of which there has been a known physical change

The Firm must also provide assessment information as requested by the Minister of Municipal Affairs in compliance with the statutory reporting requirements prescribed in the *Municipal Government Act* and its attendant regulations.

Title: 2022 Capital Project – BF 78209 Update

BACKGROUND / PROPOSAL:

Included in the Capital Budget for 2022, Council approved a project to repair/replace an existing County Bridge, BF 78209. The initial project was estimated using costs associated to a previous inspection from 2019 for a total of \$550,000.

Initial design has been completed for the project which includes the removal of the bridge and replacement with a bridge culvert. Initial estimates have been updated to reflect higher construction and material costs. In addition, it was identified that the County would be required to acquire a small portion of right-of-way to accommodate the project and allow for full road width and ditching. Lastly, the site has 2 ATCO power poles that would be in conflict and require moving, potentially at an additional cost.

At the time of tender awarding, to reflect the additional costs associated to this project administration will be requesting a budget amendment, ensuring all costs are included. Current estimated costs, excluding right-of-way acquisition or power pole relocation are \$728,000.

- (b) the Chief Administrative Officer
- (c) Designated Officers

or in their absence the person who is acting in their place.

All minutes of council meetings shall be signed by the person presiding at the meeting and the Municipal Secretary Director of Legislative and Support Services.

All bylaws shall be signed by the Chief Elected Official and the Municipal Secretary Chief Administrative Officer.

All agreements entered into by Council, cheques and other financial instruments shall be signed by the Chief Elected Officer, and by the Chief Administrative Officer, or the person acting in their place and a designated officer.

All other financial documents, options, preliminary agreements and letters of intent may be signed by the Chief Administrative Officer or designate.

All contracts over \$75,000 shall be signed by the Chief Elected Official and the Chief Administrative Officer, as per Policy FIN025.

Administration may authorize the assessor appointed by the municipality to assess the parcel at fair market value and adopt that assessment figure as the reserve bid for that parcel.

Administration may authorize an a licensed appraiser to appraise the parcel and adopt that appraisal figure as the reserve bid for that parcel.

Administration shall authorize a licensed appraiser to appraise any parcel assessed as non-residential and agricultural, and adopt that assessment figure as the reserve bid for tax recovery on that parcel.

All non-residential and non-vacant agricultural parcels shall be appraised.

The following conditions shall apply to the sale:

Each Parcel will be offered for sale, subject to a reserve bid and to the reservations and conditions contained in the certificate of title.

Terms: Cash, Certified Cheque or Money Order

Deposit: 25% of the bid amount (not to be less than \$1,000) of which \$1,000 will be non-refundable to the successful bidder) at time of the sale.

Balance: To be paid to Mackenzie County within 30 (thirty) calendar days of the date of the auction.

Mackenzie County may become owner of any parcel of land that is not sold at the public auction, immediately after the public auction.

TO REVIEW AND ADD TO POLICY:

All Agreement Holders shall purchase permits for travel and use of Municipal Roads. Permit Fees collected are to be used to maintain the Municipalities Infrastructure.

PERMITS:

Drilling/Service Rig Permits:

All Drilling/Service Rig Moves within the Municipality of Mackenzie County using County roads are required to pay a road inspection fee as outlined in the Mackenzie County Fee Schedule Bylaw for both the pre and post move road inspections, purchased through Mackenzie County. This fee may be subject to change without notice. The Agreement Holder and its Contractors are responsible for any road grading, gravelling or dust control on the County roads used during the Drilling/Service Rig Move. Any damage caused by the Agreement Holder, Contractor, or its employees related to the Drilling/Service Rig move will be assessed by the Town's Superintendent of Public Works or his designate. Any damage requiring repair becomes the responsibility of the Agreement Holder.

Soils, Frack Sand, matting, Gases, Fluids, or Tank Haul Permits:

All hauls of soils, frack sand, matting, gases, fluids or tanks where convoys of one (!) or more truck/trailer combinations are travelling in convoy to the same locations are required to purchase a haul permit from Mackenzie County.

Haul Permit Fee

The Agreement Holder using County roads for truck/trailer combination hauls, shall pay the Town \$35/day per truck/trailer combinations. This fee is to be paid within the 24-hour notification period at a Mackenzie County Office.

Staging/Parking Permit Fee:

- b) Inspect the haul route throughout the agreement date, to ensure that road conditions are kept at an acceptable standard and to ensure the hauler is following all other conditions in the agreement.
- c) Provide regular scheduled maintenance of roads. Any additional maintenance due to the haul is to be provided by the hauler.
- d) Inspect the haul road(s) within 2 working days after the haul has ceased. Of notice that the Haul is complete.
- e) Implement road bans to control haulers activities if necessary.

4. General Conditions:

- a) This agreement is non-transferable. The Party of the Second Part agrees to assume all damages resulting from the use of subcontractors.
- b) Any Hauler Agreement Holder in violation of the terms of the Road Protection Agreement may have their permission to utilize the road suspended until such time as they comply with the conditions of the Agreement to the satisfaction of Mackenzie County.
- c) Hauler Agreement Holder shall indemnify and save harmless Mackenzie County against any claims and/or proceedings from third parties as a result of approval being granted for the use of County roadways in Mackenzie County.
