

- Focused on student retention and success




Regional Demographics

Regional Demographics


Age 18-34 - expected % change in population growth between 2012 and 2022





Regional Economic profile


Projected shortages province wide in eight years

Challenges

- Facilities that are already or nearly at capacity
- Leased facilities
- Inadequate facilities in some communities
- Access to capital investment to create adequate space in the right places to support learning
- Limited student housing
- Transportation issues
- Limited availability of daycare
- The gap in labour force needs and our ability to connect the opportunities to our communities is widening.

- Collaborate to provide access to in-demand programs to meet regional and provincial labour market demand.
- Enhance Partnerships with business, industry and municipal governments to support learners and build community capacity.
- Expand our reach to regional school boards to contribute to high school completion.

Recent accomplishments

- Trades Training
 - Northern Lakes College received over \$3 M from Alberta Innovation & Advanced Education for the purchase of Crane and Hoist equipment and program delivery
 - Two Mobile Trades Labs have been built which will allow the College to deliver trades programs throughout our region wherever demand is identified; the first unit is in operation in Sturgeon First Nation
 - Trades Lab in operation at the Wabasca Campus
 - Trades Lab in High Level (underway)
 - Oilfield Operator Lab in Peace River in operation
