

# **BACKGROUND / PROPOSAL:**

Bylaw 649/07, was given first reading at the September 26, 2007 Council meeting, for a Road Closure Bylaw for the closure of that portion of internal subdivision road of Plan 042 4702. This land is located on NW 29-106-15-W5M in the Henry Wall subdivision.

At the September 26, 2007 Council meeting, first reading was passed with a condition that written consent be received from all adjacent landowners indicating that they are in favor of the road closure. Letters of approval were received by all landowners and the applicant submitted the required surveyed drawing. As all road closures are required to be approved by Alberta Transportation. Bylaw 649/07 was sent to them on March 20, 2008 for approval. On April 29, 2008 the County received the signed approval.

The road plan within this subdivision provides internal subdivision access to Lot 6, which is the most easterly lot within the subdivision. The road plan has existed since the subdivision was registered however at the time the subdivision was done the developer persuaded the subdivision authority to allow him to construct the portion of road along Lot 5. The developer was only made to construct the road up to and including the turn around on Lot 5 with the understanding that the rest of the road would be constructed at a later date and the turn around removed.

The current landowners of Lot 5 have told the Planning staff that the developer never told them of this road plan and sold them the property with the understanding that Lot 5 and 8 shared a boundary and they were never told about the existing road plan.

The current property owner applied for a yardsite development permit in March 2005. The first condition of the yardsite development permit states "prior to any new construction taking place on the subject property contact the Development Department for a Development Permit". The current property owner then proceeded to install pilings for a mobile home and moved the mobile home onto the said pilings prior to applying for a development permit. It was only when Northern Lights Gas Co-op wanted to install the gas line that the Planning department became aware of the existing mobile home and that it was located too close to the property line (road plan). The development authority approved the development permit with a 13 foot variance to allow the existing mobile home to remain in place. However if the road is ever constructed the mobile home will be 34 feet from the road.

The current property owner asked for a road closure when he found out about the road allowance and that request was considered and denied. One of the reasons being that Lot 6 is a long narrow lot and the road plan would provides access to an additional lot if the landowner ever decided to subdivide it.

## **OPTIONS & BENEFITS:**

The Planning department has no concerns regarding the requested road closure as long as all parties are aware that doing this will restrict any future subdivision of Lot 6.

All costs will be borne by the applicant.



# HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN IN RIGHT OF ALBERTA AS REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF

TRANSPORTATION

hereby grant to the Association a utility right of way for locating, constructing, maintaining and removing its distribution system including the right to carry out the necessary trimming and cutting of trees and brush, on and over such part of said lands as may be necessary from time to time. Extensions, continuations or branches of the distribution system will, where possible, and with due consideration for costs, be located according to the Grantor's wishes. The utility right of way is hereby granted for as long a period as the Association, its successors and assigns, desires and continues to maintain and operate the distribution system across the said lands.

The Grantor and the Association hereby covenant and agree to the following terms and conditions.

The Association covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from any and all liabilities, damages, costs, claims, suits or actions caused by or resulting from the construction, operation, maintenance and/or any related fixtures and appurtenances affixed to the right of way other than through willfull damage or gross negligence by the Grantor.



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

# **BACKGROUND / PROPOSAL:**

In 2005, the 94th Avenue Servicing project was completed. This project was the installation of water and sewer lines to the country residential subdivisions along 94th Avenue and the industrial area along 99<sup>th</sup> and 98<sup>th</sup> Street in La Crete. The cost of the project was to be completely recovered through local improvements, offsite levies, connection fees, and a grant.

Bylaw 555/06 Offsite Levy along 94th Avenue in La Crete was approved April 26, 2006. This bylaw allowed for an offsite levy to be charged to the undeveloped industrial areas of Section 10-106-15 W5M for the provision of sewer services to these areas.

It was discovered that the lift station along 99th Street will only service the undeveloped industrial areas of NW 10-106-15 W5M and SW 10-106-15 W5M. This leaves the complete quarter of NE 10-106-15 W5M unserviceable by sewer, although Bylaw 555/06 allows for this quarter to be charged an offsite levy for sewer. Bylaw 555/06 needs to be rescinded and a new bylaw created allowing only for the undeveloped industrial areas of NW 10-106-15 W5M and SW 10-106-15 W5M to be charged the offsite levy for sewer. Bylaw 651/07 Offsite Levy - W 10-106-15 W5M was created for this purpose.

As the new bylaw covers less acres than the original bylaw, each undeveloped industrial acre will bear a larger portion of the complete cost of installing the gravity sewer from the 94th Avenue Servicing project.

# BEING A BYLAW OF THE MACKENZIE COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

# A BYLAW OF THE MACKENZIE COUNTY FOR THE IMPOSITION OF AN OFFSITE SEWER LEVY

**WHEREAS,** the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000 c. M-26, enables a municipality by Bylaw to provide for the imposition and payment of an off-site levy in respect of land to be developed or subdivided;

**AND WHEREAS,** an off-site levy may be used to pay for all or part of the capital cost for new or expanded facilities for the storage, transmission, treatment or supplying of water; and new or expanded facilities for the treatment, movement or disposal of sanitary sewage;

**AND WHEREAS,** the purpose of the off-site levy collected under this Bylaw is to allow for installation of sanitary sewer facilities in an area specifically identified in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the Mackenzie County, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. The off site levy shall be for the provision of sanitary sewer facilities by the installation of sewer lines and lift station servicing the industrial areas of W ½ 10-106-15 W5M.
- 2. The area benefiting with the imposition of the off-site levy collected under this Bylaw is outlined on Schedule "A" attached hereto.
- Mackenzie County and the Developers/Landowners shall enter into a development agreement in respect to payment of the off-site levy collected under this Bylaw for multilot subdivisions.
- 4. In the absence of an agreement for the payment of an off-site levy, where an owner of land proposes to construct a development, the payment of the off-site levy shall be made prior to the issuance of a development permit.
- 5. The off-site levy charges for the project as described under this Bylaw are \$1,644.32 per acre.
- 6. The off-site levy under this Bylaw was calculated as follows:

Total cost of \$190,740.93 divided by 116 acres equals \$1,644.32 per acre to cover the costs of the sewer installation.

7. That Bylaw 555/06 be hereby rescinded.

This bylaw comes into force at the beginning of the day of third and final reading thereof.





#### Dear Counselors:

I am pleased to be writing to you on behalf of the Swimming Pool Committee, a sub-committee of the La Crete Recreation Board.

Our committee feels that there is enough community support substantiated through various means indicating that our community is ready for an indoor aquatic facility. A survey was conducted through the Big Deal Bulletin and at local businesses; 578 responses were received indicating 77% support. Next, community members in attendance at the loggers and truckers' hockey tournament were given an opportunity to vote where the fundraised money would go. The Pool received 72% of the votes, an overwhelming majority of the 341 who voted. Lastly, over 600 signatures were collected at the La Crete Trade Show on April 25 & 26 of individuals showing support for a swimming pool in La Crete. Our community is ready for this type of facility.

We have contacted many pools, architects and consultants and realize that we must have a feasibility study completed to continue. The objectives of the study would be to develop the program requirements for an indoor aquatics facility in La Crete, develop a facility concept plan based on the program requirements, and to complete an operating impact assessment based on the facility concept plan. At this point we are reviewing proposals and meeting with consultants about the details of a feasibility study. From the contact we have had, and the information we have seen, we foresee a complete study would cost in the range of \$40-60,000.

We need your support, counselors, for this project to move forward. We are asking that you consider paying for 50% of the cost. This study is critical at this point and your financial assistance would allow us to complete it quickly.





#### BASIC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COURSE

Managing response activities following a major emergency or disaster extends beyond the scope of routine emergency practices and procedures. The event may cause death, injury and widespread property damage. Citizens may be forced from their homes and family members separated. There is likely to be intense media interest, convergence of responders and volunteers (solicited and unsolicited) and an outpouring of offers of assistance from outside of the community. The municipality is faced with the daunting task of managing and co-ordinating response efforts and must have a plan in place to handle the increased volume, urgency, scope and intensity of activities during this time. Emergency management training courses provide essential information on Alberta's emergency management framework and legislation. Each course has been designed so that learners are given opportunities to practice theories and concepts through individual and group activities during the training session. The following information pertains to the Basic Emergency Management Course (BEM).

Completion of the BEM course is strongly recommended prior to attending other emergency management training courses.

# The intent of this course is to introduce participants to the practices and concepts of emergency management.

#### COURSE OBJECTIVE

This course provides an opportunity for people who would work together in a disaster situation to learn and practice together. Upon completion of the course, participants will have an understanding of:

- the roles and responsibilities of the municipality in preparing for and responding to a major emergency or disaster.

We suggest that these buildings, including the barn which was built in 1952, and the Gibb house built in 1943, be repaired and maintained regularly, including fixing any leaks or problems in the roof. They are an educational asset for younger generations to better understand their heritage, and we expect that they will only become more important to the community as time passes.

The most well-known event is Farmer's Day, which is usually held in the first week of June. People from a variety of communities in northern Alberta, including Fort Vermilion and High Level, will come out to take part in the auctions, tractor pulls, petting zoos, concessions, and carnival rides that are often offered at Farmer's Day.


Seating has become a problem for this event, as well as all others held outside on the museum grounds. Those who attend the mud bog or Pioneer Day should have the option to sit and watch rather than spend the entire day on their feet, and the few benches on the property are not sufficient to hold the 10,000 or so annual visitors.

Fold and go bleachers would be a great way to solve seating problems on the museum grounds. They could easily be moved from the Farmer's Day location to the mud bog. We believe that this will greatly increase the number of visitors to annual events, especially elderly and disabled persons who may have difficulty traversing the yard for the entire day. These bleachers will provide a comfortable resting area for people of all ages to enjoy.

# **Policy Statement and Guidelines**

- The Chief Administrative Officer will ensure the overall effective administration of dedicated reserves in accordance with this policy; recommending changes in policy or guidelines to Council to ensure they are employed to the benefit of the County.
- 2. Annually, in conjunction with the budget process and the presentation of the audited financial statements to **Mackenzie County** council, a list indicating the current and previous year-end balances for this reserve will be provided.
- 3. Calculation of land values shall be based on current market value specific to the location of the parcel of land being developed and the intended use of the parcel of land.
- 4. The location of Municipal Reserve taken in the form of lands shall be in an appropriate area to allow for the uses specified by the MGA.

5. The use of this reserve to fund any expenditure must be by way of a Council resolution or motion.

You will find details on how this system operates, how your community will be involved, and when the system will deliver an initial test notice to you. # THE ALBERTA EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM (AENS)

### **Background:**

The Alberta Emergency Notification System (AENS) was established by the Alberta Emergency Management Agency (AEMA) to ensure that critical emergency management information could be disseminated rapidly to a wide number of partners. The AENS is not a "public" warning system – it is instead for key personnel involved in emergency management.

This system allows the AEMA to notify municipalities and communities of critical information. Timely information ensures agencies can increase their preparedness and establish communication links with other affected parties in time to save lives and protect essential services.

### What to Expect:

The AENS is used by the AEMA to communicate in a timely manner regarding any hazard. The notification will come to Fire Chiefs, Deputy Fire Chiefs, Directors of Emergency Management, Deputy Directors of Emergency Management, First Nation Directors of Disaster Services and Chief Administrative Officers of affected communities. During tests all communities will receive the notification.

The notification will always be in voice format though it may be followed by further information through hard copy:

### (1) A Phone Call

AENS recipients first hear a voice recorded telephone message, which includes interactive prompts to enter an Identification Number (the same as the municipal code). This allows the AEMA to ensure that the call was answered by the correct person and not by voicemail. In the event that the message does go to voicemail, it will be played several times to ensure that it is recorded in its entirety on the voicemail. AENS recipients may also receive a second call if they have failed to respond to the initial call out. This will provide them with another chance to correctly respond to the voice prompts.

### (2) Hard Copy

Upon positive confirmation, AENS may also send an email or fax with additional details on the event or refer recipients to another source (e.g website). Negative confirmations will be followed up individually by AEMA staff. During tests, an email will follow the voice notification containing the general results of the test.

AENS messages are voice recorded at the time of the event and are approximately one minute in length. Recipients of a message will generally hear/respond as follows:

### **AENS Message**

This is the Alberta Emergency Notification System. Press "1" on your phone now to receive an important message. 1

Voice recorded message by system activator is inserted here. E.g. The GEOC has been activated in support of xxxx community. The contact number for the provincial GEOC is 999-1111.

To confirm receipt of this message please enter your Identification Number followed by the pound sign (#). <your municipal code and #>

Press 1 to confirm activation of your Municipal Emergency Operations centre Press 2 to confirm your Municipal Emergency Operations Centre has not been

# Alberta Emergency Notification System Frequently Asked Questions

### When will it be used?

The Alberta Emergency Notification System (AENS) will be used by the Alberta Emergency Management Agency (AEMA) to inform key stakeholders and partners of vital emergency management information during a significant event. For example an activation of the Government Emergency Operations Centre may be announced through this system, providing municipalities with essential contact details to potential government resources.

#### Who does it call?

The AENS can be used to call any combination of roles and geographical destinations, based on the event, those affected and the type of information being provided. For tests, all applicable roles from all municipalities and First Nation communities will be called. This will include the Fire Chief, the Deputy Fire Chief, the Director of Emergency Management, the Deputy Director of Emergency Management, the First Nation Director of Disaster Services or designate, and the Chief Administrative Officer of every municipality in Alberta.

### What phone number should I provide to the AENS?

It is best to provide a number that you are most likely to be reached on 24/7 (a cellphone would be ideal). It is also recommended to provide alternate phone numbers, such as an office phone number, in the event that you cannot be reached at your primary phone number.

# How do I update my contact information to ensure that I still get calls from the AENS?

AEMA District Officers currently maintain a secure database of municipal contact information. If there is any change to your contact information, please contact your AEMA district officer or the AEMA general office (aema@gov.ab.ca or 422-9000) to update it. If you do not receive a call from the AENS, but are receiving the test announcement ails, then you should contact the AEMA to ensure that your phone number is correct.

### How does the AEMA know I received the call?

When the AENS is used, a report is generated indicating the individuals and the phone numbers that were called, if a person answered or if it was picked up by voicemail, and the response of that individual.

#### What if I miss the call?

In a real event, the AENS can be used to recall any unanswered calls. The alternate phone number for individuals who have still not received the call may also be tried. Though not all tests will include testing the recalling feature, recipients can be assured that several attempts will always be made in a real event. After several automatic attempts, a manual callout will be used on remaining unreachable recipients.

### What is my Identification Number and what is it for?

Each municipality and First Nation community has an Identification Number. This number is the same number as listed in the municipal codes identified by Alberta Municipal Affairs. A list of these codes has also been attached. Please enter this number when prompted for an Identification Number. Though this code is fairly simple, it will assist the AEMA to ensure that the correct individuals are responding to the callout. Someone who is unfamiliar with the system and has received a call inadvertently will likely not know what enter. The AEMA will then use an alternate number to reach the intended recipient.

### What number will the system call from?

The system uses multiple phone lines to call recipients; it does not have a fixed phone number. In many cases, recipients may see a British Columbia or Calgary area code. There is no charge to recipients for any call received from this system.

## The system won't play the message; it just hangs up on me.

This occurs when the system does not hear the recipient at the other end of the phone either due to poor reception or speaking too softly. Please ensure that you say hello audibly and if possible, move towards an area with better reception for your second call.

# The message keeps repeating, and will not prompt me for my Identification Number.

This occurs when the system does not "hear" a recipient press "1". This can occur in instances of poor reception or recipient error. If "1" is not pressed when prompted, the system will assume it has reached a voicemail and will repeat the message several times to ensure that at least one entire message is left on your voicemail.

# Why do I have to participate in tests, and do my test results matter?

Tests are important because they help you become familiar with the system and help the AEMA to ensure that the AENS will provide an appropriate level of service to communities. General test results will be provided following every test and are used to ensure contacts are current and that communication links can be established.



At the joint zone meeting in Manning on Friday, April 25, I promised to get back to you with information on the new federal funding program that is the successor to CAMRIF. Please feel free to share the following information with your zone members as you deem appropriate.

The program is called the Building Canada Fund, and it is part of the new federal Building Canada infrastructure plan, which consolidates certain existing programs with new programs for a total funding pot of \$33 billion from 2007-2014 on projects in three priority areas: a growing economy, a clean environment and strong and prosperous communities.

There are seven separate elements within the Building Canada plan, which I have summarized below.

- Gas Tax Fund (New Deal for Cities and Communities) \$11.1 billion from 2007-2014
- GST Rebate (increased rebate to 100%) \$5.8 billion
- Base funding \$2.275 billion (Each province and territory will receive base funding of \$25 million annually for cost shared projects).
- Building Canada Fund (BCF) \$8.8 billion
- Gateways and Border Crossings \$2.1 billion
- Asia-Pacific Gateway and Corridor Initiative \$1 billion
- Public-private partnerships fund \$1.25 billion

Specifics of the Building Canada Fund are as follows: funding will be used to support public infrastructure owned by provincial, territorial and municipal governments and entities, as well as private industry in certain cases. The priority funding categories for the fund will be Core National Highway System Routes, Drinking Water, Wastewater, Public Transit and Green Energy. Other eligible investment priority areas include environmental projects (Solid Waste Management), ojects that support economic growth and development (Short-line Rail and Short-sea Shipping, Connectivity and ദരadband, Tourism and Regional and Local Airports), as well as projects that contribute to the ongoing development of safe and strong communities (Disaster Mitigation, Culture, Sport, Local Roads and Bridges, and Brownfield Redevelopment).

5/12/2008 -97Each province and territory is required to sign a Framework Agreement with the federal government, describing the structure for the administration of Building Canada Plan elements, with separate agreements to be negotiated for each of the elements in the Building Canada Plan. Eight provinces have already signed framework agreements, and Alberta's Treasury Board is currently finishing up their negotiations with the federal government for a framework agreement for Alberta. The separate sub-agreements still have to be negotiated, so it is not clear how and when funding will be made available.



Honourable Cindy Ady, Minister of Tourism, Parks and Recreation, has forwarded a copy of your recent letter regarding the Hutch Lake campground and day use area. I appreciate the opportunity to provide the following information.

Sustainable Resource Development recognizes the public recreational value that Hutch Lake provides residents of High Level and surrounding areas. Hutch Lake Provincial Recreation Area was removed from Alberta's protected area network and is now public land managed by Sustainable Resource Development. The department is agreeable to discussing the potential for public recreation to continue on public land at this site with the local municipality. While the department is not prepared to sell these lands, Mackenzie County or the Town of High Level may apply for a long-term recreational lease. Recreational leases are issued for the purpose of community-based cultural and recreational activities, such as municipal parks and campgrounds that are accessible by the general public.
